

## FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

DELORES M. KRIEG was interviewed in Building 111 at the ROCKY FLATS PLANT of the U. S. DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY (DOE), at which time she furnished the following information:

She resides at [REDACTED] in [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and has home telephone ([REDACTED]). She is a White female and was born on [REDACTED], and has Social Security Account Number [REDACTED].

She was first employed at the ROCKY FLATS PLANT on April 28, 1952, when DOW CHEMICAL CORPORATION had the contract to operate the plant. During 1952, she was hired as a clerk-typist in the Purchasing Department.

During 1970, she was promoted to Traffic Manager in the Shipping Department. Her responsibilities at this time include the safe packaging and shipping of products produced at ROCKY FLATS, which include, among others, weapons, components and waste materials. She is also in charge of employee travel.

She is supervised by MARVIN WERNER, who is Manager of the Administrative Services Division.

During 1977, the Variance Program was instituted and this program has been refined and updated over the years.

She advised that the hazardous waste and mixed waste materials developed on ROCKY FLATS is shipped to Building 664, at which time she assumes control over the materials. Building 664 is the Staging and Shipping Building in which all waste material is routed for shipping.

At the time the waste material is packaged, it is properly marked and labeled so that the material in each container is known. Copies of the waste certification in each container is furnished to the Traffic Manager. The material is then loaded onto railroad cars or trucks and then the Traffic Department prepares a bill of lading for shipping to the proper site. Waste materials are shipped to the States of Idaho and Nevada depending upon the type of waste. After the bill of lading has been prepared, either CONNIE LEININGER or DELORES KRIEG will ensure that the shipment is

correct and will sign the proper form assuming responsibility for the correct shipment.

Several months ago, Governor ROY ROMER of the State of Colorado issued a declaration stating that the capacity for storage at ROCKY FLATS would be 1,601 cubic yards. She believes this declaration was made during either November or December, 1988. The State of Idaho will only allow two railroad cars per month to be shipped to that state. At the present production level at ROCKY FLATS, more than two railroad cars per month of waste is produced and there is becoming a severe storage problem at ROCKY FLATS concerning the waste to be shipped to Idaho. She believes the capacity of 1,601 yards of waste material as set by Governor ROMER will be reached during either December, 1989 or early January, 1990, at which time she has no idea of what will happen to the waste material or the storage problems at ROCKY FLATS.

Several months ago, the Traffic Department sent 14 barrels of waste to the site in Nevada. However, the bill of lading only listed 12 barrels of waste. Because of this discrepancy, she and/or CONNIE LEININGER personally inspect each shipment of materials leaving ROCKY FLATS.

As incidents occur in which variances of rules or regulations have been noticed, a file is maintained and entitled, "The Variance Program File." She advised that since the file was opened during 1977, a total of 51 variances have been placed into the file. She had no objection to furnishing copies of each report in the file.

She is not personally aware of any reporting violations on the part of ROCKWELL INTERNATIONAL CORPORATION or DOE. She has never been told to disregard a rule or regulation and she has never been threatened with any discipline regarding the compliance with rules and regulations.

She is unaware of any unreported or documented injuries occurring at ROCKY FLATS. She believes ROCKY FLATS has an excellent medical department and each employee is obligated to report each injury.

She is unaware of any violation of the treatment and/or storage of hazardous or mixed waste at ROCKY FLATS. She is unaware of the activities in Buildings 771 and 776 concerning the incineration of waste.

She has no information concerning the illegal discharge of pollutants into Walnut Creek and Woman Creek.

She has no information concerning any possible false statements or concealment of facts concerning employees of RIC or DOE which would violate environmental laws and regulations.

On June 6, 1989, she was attending a conference in Las Vegas, Nevada, and she was unaware of a search warrant being served at ROCKY FLATS by the EPA and FBI until the evening news on June 6. She had no prior knowledge that a search warrant was going to be served at ROCKY FLATS.
